- 5. Read Matthew 28:18-20. What four things are we admonished to do in these verses? How does the authority of Jesus and his promise to go with you make you feel?
- 6. What was your reaction to hearing that nearly half of the world is considered 'unreached' with the gospel of Jesus?

- 7. Read together Jesus' words in Acts 1:8. How does this verse expand the way you look at the Great Commission?
- 8. How does your understanding of the Great Commission relate to your daily walk? Can we, or do we, get excited about going to "all nations" and forget to live out the Great Commission with our children, our neighbors, or our coworkers?
- 9. Read Ruth 1:16. How does this passionate response of Ruth to her mother-in-law mirror the Great Commission?
- 10. We'll go deeper into the Ruth story next week, but what do you know of Ruth so far? What does this tell you about God's heart for the world and for the down-and-out?

Where Do I Go from Here?

- 11. How is God calling you to join him *on* mission and *in* missions?
- 12. What concrete steps can you take toward a deeper walk with Christ and living on mission this week?
