Getting to Know Me

1. What's the craziest thing you did as a child that your parents still don't know about (or you think they don't)?

Digging Deeper

- 1. What insight or observation from Sunday's message did you find most helpful, eye-opening, or challenging? Why?
- 2. Read together 2 Samuel 11:1-6, 15. What *small* steps did David take that led to him committing those *big* sins? What could David have done to break away from this progression before he fell into sin?
- 3. Read together Psalm 32:1-5. How does concealing your sin make you feel? How does confessing your sins and forgiveness make you feel?
- 4. Read together 1 John 1:9. Is forgiveness and cleansing a promise? How valuable is this promise to you?
- 5. Read together 2 Samuel 12:13-14. Do you think we still have consequences for our choices even though we are forgiven? Why do you think David was punished for his sin even after he confessed to God and was forgiven?

- 6. Read Psalm 51:1-12 (the prayer written by David after Nathan confronted David about his sin). Who did David say he sinned against? Though David did much, including murder, to conceal his sin from the world, was David's sin ever concealed from God?
- 7. David moved from despair to confession, resulting in forgiveness and cleansing, and leading to worship then generosity. Read 1 Chronicles 29:10-14. Where are you in this progression? Why do you think the last part of this chapter speaks of all David gave to God for the establishment of His temple?
- 8. Where do you see whispers of Jesus in this chapter of the story?

Where Do I Go from Here?

- 9. What causes us to try to conceal our sin? What are some consequences of concealing the wrong we have done? Are those consequences worth it? Is God ever fooled?
- 10. All of us have things that trigger sin in our lives. Do you know what some of your triggers are? Do you need to step away from something now that may be leading to something you know you should not do? Who is a trusted person you can open up and be accountable to?

Prayer

Spend time in quiet confession. Praise God for cleansing you from all sin. Ask God to renew your heart and renew a right spirit within you. Consider praying Psalm 51 aloud together.
