# **Digging Deeper**

- 2. What insight or observation from Sunday's message did you find most helpful, eye-opening, or challenging? Why?
- 3. Read together Isaiah 46:4-7. How many times does the field commander ask who the nation is depending on, or has confidence in? Is the King of Assyria referring to the true God here or just the false gods the people of Israel have been following? He is mocking them for depending on the wrong things. What do you think the people around you believe you depend on in times of trouble? Why do they believe that? Are they correct?
- 4. Read together II Kings 18:23, 31-35. The King of Assyria promises to bathe the nation in comfort if they surrender to him. Would you be tempted? In our world today, what spiritual price do we pay for our comforts and wealth? How easy is it for you to focus on pursuing comfort over pursuing and serving God? What do you risk for depending on the wrong things?

- 5. Read II Kings 19:2, 14-19. What steps did Hezekiah take when faced with impending invasion from Assyria? What can you take from this when you face difficult situations?
- 6. After all the Israelites have seen of God's power, they continue to turn to idols, and God's judgement falls upon them. Read James 1:19-22. How does this passage apply to the history of Israel we've been studying? How does it apply to you?
- 7. Read together Isaiah 53. This was written 700 years before Jesus was born. What whispers of Jesus do you see in here? How do these prophecies affect your faith today?

#### Where Do I Go from Here?

- 8. Pastor Bill said to "Never put in front of you what God does not want in you." What does this mean in your life?
- 9. We have seen how easy it is to be drawn away from God. What habits, or spiritual disciplines, can we form to help us depend on God more, walk with Him daily, and act on His Word?
