Getting to Know Me

- 1. Would you rather run at 100 mph or fly at 20 mph?
- 2. Who is someone in your life that you think exhibits Contagious Joy? What stands out to you about them?

Digging Deeper

- 3. As you listened to the sermon this week, what new insight or question arose as you explored living out a Contagious Joy?
- 4. Take turns defining the differences between "joy" and "happiness." Which, do you think, is more "contagious"?
- 5. What do you find encouraging as you discover that joy is both a *fruit* and a *choice*? What do you find challenging about this idea?
- 6. Read Philippians 4:4-5. Why is it difficult for you to "rejoice always?" What do you think might help us become more consistently joy-filled?
- 7. Read Matthew 28:8. Have you ever experienced fear or sadness and joy at the same time? What did that feel like? How can joy exist alongside other feelings that come and go?

8. Read John 15:5-12 slowly out loud. What do you discover here about the connection of growing in a relationship with Jesus and experiencing his joy? How does this relate to our relationships with others?

Where Do I Go from Here?

- 9. How do you think Contagious Joy relate to or grow out of the values of Christlike Humility, Selfless Unity, Holy Hunger, and Overflowing Generosity?
- 10. How will you let your Contagious Joy "be evident to all" this week (Philippians 4:4-5)?
- 11. Memorize 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 this week and let these verses guide you through each day.
- 12. Take a moment to identify current situations or challenges which are obstacles to you experiencing joy. Practice the following three actions to help you experience God's will for your life in Christ Jesus.
 - Always be joyful rejoice.
 - Pray continually seek God.
 - Give thanks trust and be thankful to God for his love and mercy and his will that you have peace.
