Getting to Know Me

- 1. In what ways did you experience a *Holy Hunger* during the growth group break?
- 2. Have you ever been *chosen* to participate in something (a team, work project, advisory board)? What was the experience like?

Digging Deeper

- 3. What was something new, helpful, or challenging from Sunday's message?
- 4. Read Ephesians 1:3-14. What is the main theme of this passage and why do you think Paul is bursting with praise for God?
- 5. Who chose us and for what purpose? (vs. 3-6)
- 6. What are the lies that the world tries to tell you about who you are/your identify? Who does God say that you are?

7. When you think about your identity in Christ, do you identify more with your sinful nature, or do you identify more with the fact that you have been chosen by God?

- 8. What guarantee do we have that we are part of God's inheritance? (vs. 13-14). What does it mean that we were sealed with the Spirit?
- 9. Which of the four aspects of being sealed with the Spirit do you most resonate with right now: SECURITY, AUTHENTICITY, BELONGING, or AUTHORITY? Which aspect do you desire to relate to more?

- 10. Consider the current lens through which you view life. What can you do to change the lens through which you view life to one that more closely identifies with being chosen by God?
- 11. How should the truth that we are "in Him" change the way you live this week?
