Getting to Know Me

- 1. When was the last time you had a fulfilling day at work (or in your retirement)? What made that day special?
- 2. In your mind, what makes a good boss? What do you think makes a good employee?

Digging Deeper

- 3. What new insight or challenge did you take away from Pastor Phil's message this past Sunday?
- 4. What is your current occupation or work context?
- 5. Read Ephesians 6:5-9. How would you define serving wholeheartedly (v.7) as it relates to your tasks and attitude at work? What would serving wholeheartedly as if you were serving Jesus look like in your daily life?
- 6. What do you think of the statement, "We are all slaves to something"? Who or what drives your thoughts and behaviors? What has mastered you?
- 7. Read 1 Peter 2:15-18.
 - Here we are called "slaves of God." What kind of master is Jesus?
 - These are some tough verses, but how does it impact your understanding to realize that Peter (the author) knew persecution and death at the hands of an earthly authority?

- 8. Read Romans 1:1 (*servant* or *slave* are the same word in Greek), 2 Corinthians 4:5, Philippians 2:7, Ephesians 5:1, and Ephesians 6:9. How do these verses elevate the role of servant in God's eyes? What does this say about God's heart for the lowly?
- 9. Why do you think it is so difficult to live out our faith at work? How do you think your work environment or relationships would be impacted if you considered your work as a form of worship of God?
- 10. In what areas have you divided your life between sacred and secular? Does your submission to God change when you are in 'secular' realms versus 'sacred' settings?
- 11. Read Romans 12:1-2. How can we practically worship God through our relationships, attitudes, and tasks at work?
- 12. How does our theme verse, Ephesians 5:21, relate to the master/slave, employee/employer... relationship?

Where Do I Go from Here?

- 13. You may not be able to shift jobs, but what would happen to your attitude, fulfillment, and joy at work if you shifted 'masters' and viewed God as your ultimate boss?
