Getting to Know Me

- 1. What is something that you recently celebrated? What are you looking forward to?
- 2. The Kingdom is a hard concept to get our minds around. Are there any misconceptions of the Kingdom that have been corrected or clarified for you in this message or this series?

Digging Deeper

- 3. Read Luke 17:20-37. What question is being asked of Jesus? What in verse 21 do we learn about the Kingdom?
- 4. In verses 22-25, what does Jesus warn the disciples about and why is this warning given?
- 5. How have you seen people be unproductively sidetracked with theories around God's endgame or how *exactly* it'll all play out?
- 6. What is significant about Jesus foretelling his suffering in verse 25?
- 7. What do the following verses teach us about the role of suffering can play in our lives?

- 11. If we fully believed in the reality of Christ's obvious, sudden, immanent return, we would *always* be ready. In full honesty, do you live life as if Jesus could come at any time?
- 12. What does it look like for your heart to be prepared for Christ's return and the culmination of God's Kingdom? What is one thing that you would want to do before his return? Make a plan to start on that this week.

WAIT FOR IT... (Luke 17:22-37)

- 2. Sudden (Luke 17:26-29)

But first, Jesus will <u>suffer</u> and be <u>rejected</u>. (Luke 17:25, 33)
