



Reconstructing Truth

1. Truth is <u>ABSOLUTE</u>: if something is true, it's true for everyone, everywhere, at all times.

Truth CORRESPONDS TO REALITY.

- 2. Truth is **EXCLUSIVE**: if something is true, it necessarily excludes the opposite.
- 3. Truth is KNOWABLE:
 - ...through **REASON**.
 - ...through **REVELATION**.
 - ...through **RELATIONSHIP**.
